

ACROSS THE CONTINUUM

Perhaps as vital as the meaningful illustration of the interdependence inherent in the Path to Housing Stability is the collective awareness that no existing community-based organization is designed to work across the entirety of the continuum on behalf of all Kent County residents.

Goals & Measures

Current - Housing expense > 30% of total budget

In Kent County, 22,000 families cannot afford where they live



Goal - Housing expense < 30% of total budget

All families stably housed—or better



Current

Half of renters cannot afford their housing.

The tight housing market, increasing prices, and the lack of affordable housing options in Kent County may be playing a significant role in the increased demand for the homeless system.



Current - Equitable Homeownership Ranking

Kent County has the 6th largest gap in equitable homeownership

The Black-White homeownership gap is **40.5** and represents a ranking of **144 of 149** compared to U.S. counties with at least 20,000 African American households. The gap is higher than the actual percentage of Black homeownership, which is 36%.



American Community Survey Estimates by County from 2017 to 2020


Goal - Equitable Homeownership Ranking

Homelessness continues to rise



- —37% increase in people in the homeless system since 2017
- Nearly two-thirds of that increase are children and adults in families
- Nearly half of the overall increase are African American children and adults in families


